After School Clubs

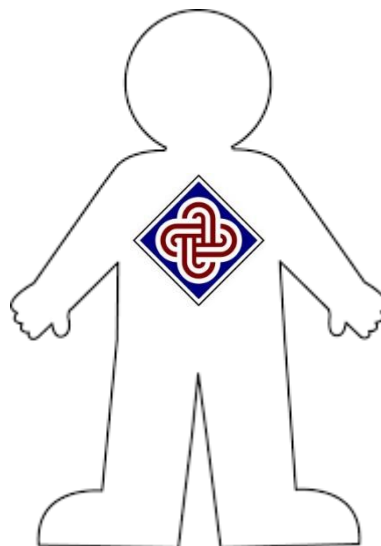


Opportunities to socialise and communicate with a range of adults and peers from across the different classes in school.

Quality, skilled teaching provision for Enrichment afternoon. Providing opportunities to work with specialist sports, music and drama teachers.

One-to-One Support & School-Led Tutoring

Increased engagement with an aim to accelerate progress. Targeted interventions to support identified areas of need. Plus, training and resources for interventions.



EHCP focused support



One-to-one support to make accelerated progress towards EHCP outcomes. Small class sizes and individualised learning.

Yellow – Wellbeing and Readiness to learn

Nurture Support

Staff trained by Educational Psychologists to plan and deliver programmes of support to pupils who are experiencing temporary or longer term additional emotional needs.



Family Support Worker



Support families with practical help and emotional support.

Attendance Improvement Strategy

Individualised support to promote good attendance and reduce incidents of persistent absence.



Behaviour Support Staff



Specific, targeted support for individuals to develop social and emotional skills and assist pupils in crisis.
